To be eligible for the 2012 Youth Olympic Games, male athletes must have been born between 1 January 1996 and 31 December 1996 and female athletes must have been born between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 1994.

B. Qualification System

PERFORMANCE & CONTINENTAL REPRESENTATION

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S 5-TEAM TOURNAMENTS

The men's and women's tournaments will be composed of the following teams:

- Austria 34 athletes (2 teams; one male, one female), selected for their ability to play on a national team
- 2011 Top 8 World Ranked Nations 136 athletes (8 teams; four male and four female), selected for their ability to play on a national team

The operation of one men's national team tournament of five teams plus the operation of one women's national team tournament of five teams will form the tournament program. The proposed make-up of the tournament program is to operate with 10 national teams from 9 separate nations.

Austria, as the host nation will be awarded one (1) male team and one (1) female team to participate in the tournament program.

The remaining eight (8) teams will be awarded to the top (8) eight nations, whose joint Men's and Women's 2011 IIHF World Ranking qualifies them for participation in the tournament. Each qualified nation will be allowed to select only one team to participate. The genders for teams will be awarded by ranking where the higher ranked nations will have first option of selecting team gender for their participation in the tournament program.

MEN'S INDIVIDUAL SKILLS CHALLENGE

Non-competing nations - 15 male athletes selected as the top athletes in their category from a global skills test and from a nation <u>not</u> competing in either the men's or the women's tournament.

The qualification period will carried out in accordance to the YOG 2012 - Qualification System Principles Timelines (please see detailed timeline below).

The players that will be eligible for competing in the Skills Challenge will be female athletes born in 1994 and from a nation not competing in the women's tournament.

These qualifications will be organized and done in two (2) stages.

The first stage will be carried out nationally with every participating National Association conducting the Skills Challenge in their own nation to determine the winners. Each winner will be eligible to compete in the second stage. The second stage will be done internationally at the Global Skills Challenge held during the 2011 Hockey Development Camp in Vierumäki, Finland.

HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION

Austria, as the host nation will be awarded one male team and one female team to participate in the 5-team tournaments.

C. Reallocation of unused quota places

REALLOCATION PROCEDURE

Any places that are not taken up in the Individual Skills Challenge will be reallocated to the next best ranked athletes at the Global Skills Challenge held during the 2011 Hockey Development Camp in Vierumäki, Finland.
