



## 2014 Sochi Olympic Games | WA Olympian Results

<b>Skeleton</b>	<b>Lucy Chaffer</b>	Making her Olympic debut, Lucy finished in 17th place. Lucy recovered from a poor first run and improved throughout the competition with her second and fourth runs being the 9th and 10th fastest overall.
<b>Bobsleigh</b>	<b>Lucas Mata &amp; Gareth Nichols</b>	Lucas and Gareth both made their Olympic debut in Sochi as brakemen in the Men's 4-Man Bobsleigh crew. Alongside Heath Spence and Duncan Harvey they finished 22nd.



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<b>Archery</b>	<b>Taylor Worth</b>	At his 2 <sup>nd</sup> Olympics, Taylor won a <b>Bronze Medal</b> in the team's event. Taylor made it through to the quarter final in the individual event and missed out on going to through to the semi-final by only 2 points.
	<b>Alice Ingley</b>	Successfully made it through the 1/32 round and was eliminated in the 1/16 round.

<b>Athletics</b>	<b>Peter Bol</b>	Competed in the 800m in a time of 1min 49.36sec ranking him 41 in the world.
	<b>Kim Mickle</b>	At her 2 <sup>nd</sup> Olympics, Kim competed in the Javelin and dislocated her shoulder during a qualifying round throw of 57.2m achieving a ranking of 22.
	<b>Sam McEntee</b>	Competed in the 5000m, finishing in a time of 13min 50.55sec ranking him 35 in the world.

<b>Basketball</b>	<b>Damian Martin</b>	The Australian Boomers with Damian Martin had an outstanding tournament in the lead up to the Semi Finals where they went down to Serbia. In their Bronze medal game the Boomers went down to Spain by just 1 point.
	<b>Natalie Burton</b>	The Australian Opals with Nat Burton went through the group rounds undefeated and made it through to the quarter finals where Serbia ended their Rio Campaign winning by just 2 points.

<b>Canoe Sprint</b>	<b>Stephen Bird</b>	At his 2 <sup>nd</sup> Olympics, Stephen competed in the K1 200m in a personal best time of 34.58sec in the Semi final, making it through to the final finishing 8th in the world.
	<b>Daniel Bowker</b>	Daniel Bowker competed in the K2 200m making it through to the B Final placing 3rd and ranking him 11th in the world.
	<b>Ferenc Szekszardi</b>	Ferenc Szekszardi contested the C1 200m in a time of 44.29sec earning a ranking of 23 in the world. In the C2 1000m Ferenc made the B Final and finished 2nd and an overall ranking of 10 in the world.

<b>Cycling Track</b>	<b>Melissa Hoskins</b>	At her 2 <sup>nd</sup> Olympics, Melissa competed in the Women's Team Pursuit and made it through the Qualifications and Rounds and faced Italy in their final pursuit, winning and ranking them 5th overall.
	<b>Sam Welsford</b>	Sam Welsford, in the Men's Team Pursuit won a <b>Silver Medal</b> in a time of 3min 51sec narrowly missing the Gold Medal by just 0.74sec.

<b>Cycling BMX</b>	<b>Lauren Reynolds</b>	At her 2 <sup>nd</sup> Olympics, Lauren competed in the individual event and missed the final of the women's BMX after a crash in the semi finals. Lauren managed to cross the line and placed her 6th in the semi final.
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<b>Diving</b>	<b>Maddison Keeney</b>	Maddison a <b>Bronze Medal</b> in the Women's Synchronised 3m Springboard. In the 3m Springboard individual event, Maddison also made it through to the final and achieved 5th position overall.
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<b>Golf</b>	<b>Minjee Lee</b>	In the Women's Individual Stroke Play Rounds, Minjee finished 7th overall. Lee fired a 67 that included six birdies in the final 14 holes but it wasn't enough to catch the medal contenders.
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<b>Hockey</b>	<b>Fergus Kavanagh</b>	The Men's team with Fergus Kavanagh at his 3 <sup>rd</sup> Olympics and Aran Zalewski had mixed results in their Olympic Campaign making it through to the quarter finals and lost to the Netherlands.

	<b>Kathryn Slattery</b>	The Women's team with Kathryn Slattery also had a tough tournament making it through to the quarter final and lost to New Zealand. Kathryn scored both goals for the Hockeyroos in the game against New Zealand to end the tournament as the Hockeyroos top scorer

<b>Rowing</b>	<b>Rhys Grant</b>	Competing in the Men's Single Scull, Rhys made it through to the B final, finishing in a personal best time of 6min 51.90sec and an overall ranking of 9th in the world.
	<b>David Watts</b>	Competed in the Men's Double Scull making it through to the B final where he finished 1st in a time of 6min 58.11sec placing him 7th in the world.
	<b>Alexandra Hagan</b>	At her 2 <sup>nd</sup> Olympics, Alexandra put in a solid performance in the Women's eight crew in the heat and competed in the repechage placing 5th in a time of 6min 40.45sec.

<b>Sailing</b>	<b>Carrie Smith</b>	Competed in the Women's Two Person Dinghy - 470, facing tough conditions in the Marina da Gloria in Rio to finish 12th overall.

Tamsin also made the final of the 400m freestyle, finishing 6 <sup>th</sup> in the world in a time of 4min 5.30sec. In her 800m freestyle, she finished 7 <sup>th</sup> in her heat swim in a time 8min 36.62sec
	Brianna Throssell	Competing in the 200m Butterfly, Brianna made the final finishing 8 <sup>th</sup> fastest in the world in a time of 2min 7.87sec.
Synchronised Swimming	Danielle Kettlewell	Competed in the Teams Free Routine which was inspired by Australia's unique flora and fauna, finishing 8 <sup>th</sup> in the world with a score of 149.5000. Rose Stackpole also competed in the synchronised swimming duet with a personal best performance in a score of 148.4027
