# Message from the President



It gives me pride and pleasure to introduce this comprehensive guide to the membership of Australia's team for the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens. It is a talented team, the largest this nation has ever sent away, and we have high hopes that it will be among the most successful at these Games. Its stated mission, in fact, is to finish among the top five nations in the overall medal tally – an objective that is clearly within its competence, given performances during the past year.

Every Olympic Games becomes a piece of history – but there is already an extra significance to this year's, which return the modern Games to both the city of their birth and the land of their ancient beginnings. It was in 1896 that Athens played host to a modest but ambitious competition that signalled the revival of Greece's Ancient Olympics. An all-male total of 245 athletes from 15 countries competed in nine sports. The founder of the modern Olympics, Pierre de Coubertin, had a vision: he wanted not only to renew those Games of a thousand years before, but to see the modern version of them endure, and prosper. They have done so – to such a degree that 10,500 athletes from 201 countries will be competing this time in 28 Olympic sports, watched by a global television audience of four billion. And indications are that close to 40 per cent of them will be female.

Australia can take great satisfaction in the knowledge that it has, like Greece, competed in every Games of the modern era. In that time we have won a total of 349 Olympic medals, 104 of them gold. As someone who is privileged to be leading the Australian team for the fifth consecutive time, I feel proud that two of our competitors in Athens – the horseman Andrew Hoy and the sailor Colin Beashel – are about to embark on their sixth Olympics. Another three – the archer Simon Fairweather

and the rowers Mike McKay and James Tomkins – will be making it five in a row. Another strong reason for pride is the fact that, with the exception of handball, Australia has qualified for every sport on the Olympic program. And not only that: we have also qualified for 11 team sports in Athens ... more than any other nation apart from the host country, Greece.

We had tremendous success at the Sydney Games, with 58 medals, 16 of them gold, and a fourth-place medal tally. Historically, many host nations have tended to perform quite a lot worse in the following Games. On form, I believe we can be confident that Australia will reverse that trend. Thanks to the support of the Australian Government and the Australian, state and the territory Institutes of Sport direct to our member sports and athletes; the \$26 million of income from our Sydney Olympic Games' legacy; our many world-wide and national sponsors; and, the fundraising efforts of our State Olympic Councils' Team Appeal Committees, this is a wonderfully well-prepared team.

I believe it will make all of us very proud, and will honour the spirit of our first Olympian, Edwin Flack, who also went to Athens with high hopes.

The two flag-bearers at Moscow were to symbolise unity. Australia, like a number of European countries, did not march behind its national flag but behind that of the International Olympic Committee.

**Author's Note:** Although all winners are generally accorded gold-medal status, gold medals for winners were not introduced until 1904. In 1896 winners received olive branch crowns, diplomas and silver medals. In 1900 prizes for amateurs consisted of objets d'art, often sculptures, and professionals like Donald Mackintosh received prize money plus a souvenir medal.

## Our own Lion of Athens



Australia is rightly proud of its rare, unbroken link with the Olympics, ever since their birth

It was in the old, marble Panathinaiko Stadium, venue for the archery events at this year's Athens Olympics, that Australia's first assault on the Modern Olympic Games was launched. The year was 1896, the stadium was a brand, spanking new showpiece, and the Australian contingent at the first of the new Olympics consisted of one young middle-distance runner from Melbourne, Edwin Flack. He wasn't strictly representing Australia, because the nation had not then been born. He came from one of a loose collection of colonies, a group that would not be federated until 1901, and he chose to run at the Games in the dark-blue vests of his old school, Melbourne Grammar, and his home-town club, the Melburnian Hare and Hounds.

Flack, 21, was studying accountancy at the time in London. He took a month's leave to travel to Athens, rented a room there with an English friend, George Robertson, then embarked on what turned out to be the most exciting week of his life. In that marble stadium he won a heat and final of the 800 metres, as well as the sudden-death 1500 metres. Then, on a euphoric high, he tackled the marathon --- a distance he had never run before --- and for a while looked like winning it. He was leading at the 34-kilometre mark until he began to stagger, then finally collapsed. The race, won by the Greek Spiridon Louis, finished in the Panathinaiko Stadium, just as this year's marathon will. At the end of the week Flack was being followed everywhere by adoring crowds, who had taken to calling him "the Lion of Athens".

Athens, with a population of 80,000 spread mainly around the Acropolis, was something of a carnival town that springtime, and Flack was a joyous, have-a-go competitor. In company with his pal Robertson, he tried his hand in the tennis competition, although neither had great skill at the game. Both lost their first-round singles matches, and together they were beaten in their only doubles encounter. But because only five pairs entered the doubles, and their first-round opponents did not turn up, their only match became in effect a semi-final. They have thus been accorded the status of bronze medallists.

Edwin Flack, who died in 1935, was Australia's true Olympic pioneer. He was the first hero: the first to compete, the first to win. Moreover, his unheralded appearance in Athens gave Australians their first real awareness of the existence of the Olympic Games. Australia is rightly proud of its rare, unbroken link with the Olympics, ever since their birth. It's timely just now to remember that it is a record which simply could not have existed without that modest young man, our own Lion of Athens.
